

NPCIL highlights its cleanliness and environment protection initiatives during Swachhta Pakhwada at HWB

HWB celebrated the Swachhta Pakhwada during the last two weeks of April'16, the highlight of which was a series of presentations by various DAE units on the initiatives taken by them to keep their environment and surroundings clean and sanitized. NPCIL was invited to share its actions taken in this direction with an audience of 200 at the venue on 27th April.

NPCIL's commitment to preserve and enhance the environment around its plants was presented pictorially by displaying visuals of how our plants have become habitats for a variety of plants, animals and migratory birds. Environment Stewardship programme of NPCIL in collaboration with credible bodies like BNHS was presented.

ISO 14001 programme of NPCIL -which obligates its sites to identify all their activities (from fuel handling to hospital waste management) that can impact the environment and enforce proper controls for these – was discussed. The monitoring and measurement of environmental parameters such as air, water and soil quality by independent agencies was underscored along with all other environmental risk mitigation processes.

The cleanliness drive commenced at NUB and the activities of the Swachhta Committee of NPCIL were brought out.

We all acknowledge that man has moved far, far from leading a harmonious and healthy life on this planet. Having witnessed nature's fiery-eyed retaliation in the form of katrinas and forest-fires it becomes our moral obligation to revisit our ancient traditions while we focus attention on ecological harmony and cosmic symbiosis.
